Answers to Part VII: Stance on Issues

1. The role of government should be national defense, law and order, education and transportation. Some social spending will be necessary until we find a way to get everyone working again, but it should have a time limit on it. The best we can do for our State is to reverse the trend toward unemployment and welfare.
2. Free trade has always been a hallmark of American economic policy and should remain so. Having said that, we also need to become better at being Patriots. A lot of regulation has come about as a result of unchecked greed and the willingness to do whatever is necessary to succeed. True patriots are those that don't rape the land or its people for the betterment of their bottom line. We need leaders in government and industry that care for the American way of life and include the vision of a viable, sustainable future in their business models.
