Coincidentally Woodhaven was also the name of our first community.

In 1997 we merged Masonry Homes with Macks Homes and formed Masonry Macks Homes with a plan to create enough mass to compete in the market with the national builders. By the end of 1997 all parties recognized that a company with two heads would not succeed and my family and I purchased all of the stock of the entity and changed the name to Masonry Homes, Inc. In November of 2002 we sold Masonry Homes, Inc. to Engle Homes, a division of Technical Olympic a national home builder.
