In 1991, while serving as Mayor of Union Bridge, I created a fund raising committee to build a new town office building in Union Bridge, at a cost of \$200,000, which was paid off within 15 years thru fund raisers and donations. Building was furnished with used furniture still being used today showing economic responsibility.

I have managed to keep the tax rate for Union Bridge residents consistent, only increasing water and sewer rates bi-annually to maintain infrastructure.

While serving as County Commissioner, I worked with the State Fire Marshall's office to help institute Carroll County Sprinkler Ordinance for single family dwellings which is now a state fire code.
