I was born and raised in Carroll County and during my childhood I worked from the age of 12, serving in different labor type of jobs. My career as a public servant began at the age of 18 just out of high school when I joined the Maryland State Police. I had dreams of being a Trooper and not only did I succeed, I rose through the ranks of Sergeant, became a flight paramedic on the world renown helicopter system and supervised a team of investigators through my career.

I volunteered from the age of 18 at the Westminster Volunteer Fire Department, rising through the ranks to Chief of the Department and administratively through the ranks as 1st Vice President. I retired from the MSP in 2002 with a 28 year career and currently volunteering at Westminster Fire Department with 39 years of service to my community.

When taking office as Mayor in 2009, the city was in a critical budget crisis, as the Governor slashed over 1.4 million dollars from our budget through the elimination of the highway user funds and the state aid to police. The city also had looming issues with over 25 negative audit findings in how business was being conducted. At the time, the city did not have reserve funds, nor any other sources to draw upon to balance the budget. As roads were crumbling from blizzards and harsh winters, the following actions were taken. The structural deficit was reduced by elimination of un-filled positions; no positions refilled; major reduction in staff spending; no pay raises for employees for over 6 years; removal of take home cars for police; and elimination of a police executive position. Even with all of this, the city fell short of its ability to balance the budget requiring a tax increase. Within a two year period, the audit findings were reduced in half; city revenue increased and expenditures continued to decrease. Within a three year period, the revenues increased, taxes were returned to citizens twice and audit findings were eliminated completely. While we suffered tremendously, the City of Westminster is now in excellent financial standing with over \$600,000 in reserve; roads are being maintained and resurfaced. I consider this a monumental success.

I have lived and worked in Carroll County for my entire life. I raised three children who are now raising their children in Carroll County. Now I wish to make a difference for the Citizens of District 5 and continue my service to the community. In addition to my ability to be a strong leader, I am also a hard worker and have a very strong work ethic.

While I understand that I would represent my local constituent's, I will also have many legislative issues to address and will utilize my broad knowledge base and level headed approach to policy to make decisions based on what is best for our citizens.

1. Please describe what you believe is the role of government

Government's role is to protect the rights and freedom of the citizens of the United States of America. The value of local government officials is to be able to undertake this task at the lowest possible level such as the local city, county or state elected officials.

2. Please explain your economic views and major economic influences

I believe government should maintain a balanced budget utilizing conservative principles in preparing and implementing a spending plan. I have served on the Westminster City Council and as Mayor for the past 10 years and believe in prioritizing spending based on revenue projections balanced with the needs of the City. My local top priorities for the City of Westminster are public safety, infrastructure and economic development.

3. What is your position on gun control and the Second Amendment

I believe in the 2nd Amendment rights of citizens to carry fire arms. I do have a concern in the safety aspect of being a gun owner. As a retired police officer I cannot carry a weapon without an annual certification.

4. What is your position on abortion and euthanasia

I oppose abortion and euthanasia. While there are many very convincing arguments involving these issues, I have some understanding of abortions occurring after a crime of force on females and related decisions to abort. I would take into consideration any legislation that had these types of stipulations as they present.

5. What is your position on taxes

I am opposed to raising taxes as a general rule. As Mayor I was in a position where we had no choice but to raise taxes due to a \$1.2Million shortfall. In our case the State Government reduced highway user funds and police aid and we had no choice but to increase taxes to balance the budget. Going back to my belief in the role of government; "we have a responsibility to protect the safety of our citizens".

6. What is your position on common core

Parents and teachers have shared with me that they have very little understanding of the program requirements and the funding needed is not being provided to implement all appropriate classes and class sizes to meet common core requirements. I don't support ANY unfunded mandates that have the lingering effect on tax payers from higher government entities.

7. How would you work to create jobs

Government creates business opportunities. Jobs are created by entrepreneurs, small businesses and those who believe in capitalism. Government can be the support mechanism for business owners to provide necessary infrastructure to include, roads, water, sewer, broadband services and similar types of supportive roles.

Local government officials should work to bring business to Maryland to employ our citizens and feed our local, regional and state economy. The Governor and Legislators can work together to create a business friendly atmosphere with lower corporate taxes; and grant opportunities for job creators and start-up entrepreneurs. The Governor has submitted legislation to support this effort and I would support his current bills.

8. Please explain your position on Obamacare and healthcare in general

I am opposed to government at any level interfering with the healthcare industry. Capitalism works and if competition across state lines were allowed, the art of finding the most appropriate, cost effective level of healthcare services could be an individual decision once again. There will always be a need for states to provide the guided resources to gain care for the less fortunate. However, Obamacare provides a loophole for some business owners to hire employees for limited work schedules to avoid providing health insurance while middle class families are paying a disproportionate share of the costs of healthcare. What is the incentive for citizens to pay for government healthcare while those without jobs can receive healthcare for free?

9. What is your stance on converting from a commissioner form of government to a county executive form of government

At this point, I don't believe the citizens are ready for the Home Rule form of government with a County Executive. While I see each of the eight municipalities working extremely well with this type of similar government, many don't see the need to expand the roles of our current elected officials. My concern is that county staff directors have 5 leaders who have varying opinions and their leadership can be very confusing when trying to implement strategic plans and carrying out daily operations.
